My right foot became badly infected and required surgery as consequence of action

of the employees of Landlord Steven Croman.  
On Nov. 27 in the morning officers at my door were demanding that I open the door, I telephoned to my guardian who said do not open I am coming over. They threatened to break the door. My neighbor Terry coming by said "Crack the door Helen, I am here." I did. And immediately an iron bar was forced into door frame. I took my coat off the knob of the door and stepped out. Immediately I was harshly pushed into a quarry seat. I gave my keys to Terry and asked the officers to lock my door which they did. They gave the keys back to Terry.

I was terrified of what was happening as they carried me handcuffed down stairs into Ambulance and to 68th street, I think to Cornell Presbyterian ER. by 3pm I was released. It was raining, I walked to 67st bus stop so I had enough change for car fare. I missed 2nd Ave transfer stop and had to walk back from 1st Ave my shoes got wet and I had to stop several times I got so tired. My feet were painful rubbing against wet shoes. 2nd Ave Bus took me to Flushing and Forsythe and I had to walk in wet shoes several more blocks getting to 20 Prince at 6:15 pm. Super and MaryAnne were waiting for me with my keys in the lobby. When I came up I noticed that my right was raw and blood was on the sock from the friction of the wet shoe. In December it was getting better, I am diabetic and healing is slow. On Wed. Jan 9 at the Bowery Mission Clinic they looked at my right foot put me on Cephalexin 500mg 2x day. I could not walk and Linda found for me home call paediatrician Dr. Nau who saw me on W. Jan. 14 and told me immediate hospitalisation at 6:32 pm I took taxi to Beth Israel E.R. and was admitted Dr. Nau said that the foot was gangrenous.

Jan 25, 2013 had surgery, partial removal of infected  
bone. It financial hardship, much mental  
anguish and violation of my human rights, and  
civil rights by Janet and Jackie,  
employees of owner/land lord Steven Croman,  
I am charged \$1,000,- by Cornell hospital  
ambulance \$400,- forth coming Beth  
Israel charges, and much pain and suffering.
